

Cut Flower Care Tips



- We harvest flowers in the very early morning to give you healthy and well-hydrated flowers. We follow industry standards in post-harvest care to make sure your flowers last as long as possible.
- After purchasing your flowers, take them home immediately. If you can't go home right away, take them inside with you to your next destination, or leave them in the shade. Just make sure you don't leave them in a hot car or in the sun.
- When you arrive home, prepare a sparkling clean vase and add water. Consider adding 1 drop of bleach to the water to kill bacteria from the flowers. You may add flower food according to the directions on the packet if you want.
- Cut 1/8-1/4 inch off the bottom of the stems, and place them in the water. This opens the stems and makes sure the flowers can "drink" as much water as they need.
- Change the water every other day, and wash the vase when you change the water for best results. Clip the ends of the stems again each time you change the water.
- These tips apply to any cut flowers, whether you picked them from your own yard or purchased them at the store. Enjoy!

Expected Vase Life for Flowers:

7-10 Days:

Lisianthus, Sunflowers, Celosia, Basil, Marigolds, Snapdragons, Larkspur, Statice, Sweet William, Strawflower

5-7 Days:

Zinnias, Cosmos, Queen Anne's Lace, Nigella, Delphinium
